UNITED STATES' EIGHTH REPORT TO THE MAGISTRATE JUDGE

In accordance with the settlement agreement between the United States and the City of Philadelphia, and the settlement between the parties in the above-captioned case, the United States provides this report for the period of August 1, 2010, to November 30, 2010, on the status of the United States' polling place surveys.

This report provides only a summary of the actual survey results. Copies of the surveys have been provided to all the parties. If the Court would like further information, copies of surveys can be provided as well.

ACCESSIBLE POLLING PLACES

The following polling places have been surveyed by the United States and have been determined to be accessible under the standards agreed to in this case. We indicate the ward, division, name, and entrance location of each polling place. For these polling places, the main entrance used by voters on election day is also the accessible entrance.

- None to report.

POLLING PLACES THAT MAY BE MADE TEMPORARILY ACCESSIBLE ON ELECTION DAY

The following polling places have been surveyed by the United States and have been determined to be inaccessible under the standards agreed to in this case. For these polling places, there is a temporary measure(s) that may make them accessible on election day. We include the temporary measures as well as the identification of the polling places and the primary entrance. Additionally, when there is an alternate accessible entrance, we indicate whether the accessible entrance should not be re-designated as the exclusive entrance and signs should be posted directing voters to the accessible entrance, or whether the accessible entrance should be re-designated as the exclusive entrance. If an alternate entrance is not indicated, then the primary entrance and the accessible entrance are the same entrance.

Also included in this category are polling places that are otherwise accessible but the accessible entrance is not the primary entrance; a recommendation to re-designate the accessible entrance as the exclusive entrance is provided as a temporary remedy.

Additionally included in this category are polling places that are accessible but require signs to be posted to direct voters to an accessible entrance when it cannot be

re-designated as the exclusive entrance. We include the reason why the accessible entrance should not be re-designated as the exclusive entrance.

Finally, we have included recommendations for permanent modifications for publicly-owned buildings where it may be reasonable to modify inaccessible features. Where appropriate, we have provided a recommendation as to how they may be reasonably, permanently modified to remove barriers to accessibility.

POLLING PLACES THAT ARE INACCESSIBLE AND SHOULD BE RELOCATED

The following polling places have been previously surveyed by the United States and it was determined that the temporary measures recommended cannot be implemented to make the polling places accessible on election day. Thus, the polling places are inaccessible. For this group of polling places, we recommend that each polling place be relocated to an existing polling place location or to another site. If the City determines that the relocation of a particular division is not possible, then the United States will continue to work with the City to locate an alternative location for the division.

- Ward 34, Division 30, Overbrook Park Church of Christ, 7630 Woodbine Avenue, is inaccessible.

- Ward 34, Divisions 32, 37, 39, 41, Overbrook Library, Haverford and Woodbine Avenues

- Ward 52, Division 18, St. Barabara's Church, 5359 Lebanon Avenue, is inaccessible.

- Ward 52, Divisions 15, 19, Pinn Memorial Baptist Church, 54th Street and Wynnefield Avenue
- Ward 52, Division 16, Fairview Arms Apartments, 5219 Wynnefield Avenue
- Ward 52, Division 13, Settlement Music School, 4910 Wynnefield Avenue
