In accordance with the settlement agreement between the United States and the City of Philadelphia, and the settlement between the parties in the above-captioned case, the United States provides this bi-monthly report for the period of June 10 to July 31, 2009, on the status of the United States' polling place surveys. Copies of the surveys have been provided to all the parties.

This report provides only a summary of the actual survey results. If the Court would like further information, copies of surveys can be provided as well.

ACCESSIBLE POLLING PLACES

The following polling places have been surveyed by the United States and have been determined to be accessible under the standards agreed to in this case. We indicate the ward, division, name, and entrance location of each polling place. For these polling places, the main entrance used by voters on election day is also the accessible entrance.

POLLING PLACES THAT MAY BE MADE TEMPORARILY ACCESSIBLE ON ELECTION DAY

The following polling places have been surveyed by the United States and have been determined to be inaccessible under the standards agreed to in this case. For these polling places, there is a temporary measure(s) that may make them accessible on election day. We include the temporary measures as well as the identification of the polling places and the primary entrance. Additionally, when there is an alternate accessible entrance, we indicate whether the accessible entrance should not be re-designated as the exclusive entrance and signs should be posted directing voters to the accessible entrance, or whether the accessible entrance should be re-designated as the exclusive entrance. If an alternate entrance is not indicated, then the primary entrance and the accessible entrance are the same entrance.

Also included in this category, are polling places that are otherwise accessible but the accessible entrance is not the primary entrance; a recommendation to re-designate the accessible entrance as the exclusive entrance is provided as a temporary remedy.

Additionally included in this category are polling places that are accessible but require signs to be posted to direct voters to an accessible entrance when it cannot be re-designated as the exclusive entrance. We include the reason why the accessible entrance should not be re-designated as the exclusive entrance.

Finally, we have included recommendations for permanent modifications for publicly-owned buildings where it may be reasonable to modify inaccessible features. Where appropriate,

we have provided a recommendation as to how they may be reasonably, permanently modified to remove barriers to accessibility.

- Ward 1, Divisions 4, 8, SS Neumann Goretti High School (Primary Entrance: 10th Street; Accessible Entrance: South Auditorium door)
 1. Re-designate entrance at South Auditorium door as the exclusive entrance.
- Ward 1, Division 7, Garage (Pierce Street)
 1. Provide 3/4 inch threshold ramp at garage door entrance.
 2. The garage door is the primary entrance and can be made accessible as indicated above. We were told that the garage door is open for all voters except for some rare occasions when it is very cold. In such instances, a door to the house (which has a step) is used by voters without disabilities and the garage door is used by voters with disabilities. In these circumstances, a sign next to the garage door and next to the entrance to the house would be necessary to direct voters with disabilities to the correct door and a person or a call bell should be posted outside to open the garage door.
- Ward 1, Divisions 14, 15, Dickinson Square Rec Center (There are 6 entrances to the building with at least one entrance on each side; Accessible Entrance: 4th and Morris Streets)
 1. Re-designate entrance at 4th and Morris as the exclusive entrance.
- Ward 2, Division 2, Fire Engine Company #3 (Primary Entrance: Washington Avenue; Accessible Entrance: Washington Avenue bay door)
 1. Do not re-designate the accessible entrance as the exclusive entrance because the accessible entrance is the bay door and is not kept open all the time when there is inclement weather.
 2. Post signs next to the bay door and the other front entrance directing voters with disabilities to the accessible entrance through the bay door.
- Ward 2, Division 3, Saigon Maxim Restaurant (Washington Avenue parking lot)
 1. Provide 1 inch threshold ramp at curb ramp transition to parking lot.
 2. Provide traffic cones to designate entrance to temporary ramp and curb ramp as “No Parking.”
- Ward 2, Divisions 5, 8, 10, St. Maron’s Church (Alder Street)

1. Prop open both leaves of exterior and interior vestibule doors at Alder Street.
- Ward 2, Divisions 9, 19, Academy at Palumbo School (Catharine Street)

Temporary Measures:

 1. Prop open left leaf of double entrance doors.
 2. Provide a rubber mat over the threshold of the entrance doors.
 3. Keep the hall door propped open.
 4. Keep an attendant at the auditorium door, since it is a fire door.

Permanent Measures:

 1. Remove approximately 20 inches of the railing that is perpendicular to the entrance doors to create 60 inches x 18 inches clear space.
 2. Install automatic door opening device(s) (with push plate wall switches for ingress and egress) so that existing entrance doors at the entrance with the ramp open automatically.
 3. Mount the push plate wall switches so that the centerline is no higher than 48 inches above the finished floor/ground.
 - Ward 2, Division 11, Santore (Southwark) Library (Primary Entrance: 7th Street; Accessible Entrance: Beulah Street)
 1. Do not re-designate the accessible entrance as the exclusive entrance because it is an emergency exit door with a buzzer that cannot handle election day traffic.
 2. A person needs to be available during voting hours to open the accessible entrance on Beulah Street, which has a buzzer.
 - Ward 2, Divisions 15, 26, 27, St. Stanislaus Parish Hall (Primary Entrance: Fitzwater Street; Accessible Entrance: parking lot door)
 1. Re-designate entrance at parking lot door as the exclusive entrance.
 2. Provide a portable threshold ramp or mat over rear entrance threshold.
 3. Prop open rear entrance door.
 4. Prop open hallway doors.
 5. The furniture along the accessible route needs to be moved so that the accessible route is at least 36 inches wide from the entrance door at the rear of the polling area.
 - Ward 2, Divisions 17, 24, Fleisher Art Memorial School (Catharine Street)
 1. Keep both hallway doors propped open.
 2. Move voting machines out of church area and into the main lobby area.
 - Ward 6, Division 1, Fire Engine Company #5 (Side door is primary entrance)

1. Move bench on the right of the walkway so that the accessible route to the side door is at least 36 inches wide.
- Ward 6, Divisions 14, 18, Stephen Smith Towers (Belmont Avenue)
 1. Prop open both leaves of double doors to voting area.
 - Ward 8, Division 5, First Baptist Church (Primary Entrance: 17th Street; Accessible Entrance: Sansom Street)
 1. Re-designate entrance at Sansom Street as the exclusive entrance.
 2. Use a mat for the threshold.
 3. Prop open the entrance doors.
 4. Prop open all the hallway doors. The accessible route goes through the sanctuary.
 5. Prop open doors to voting area.
 - Ward 8, Divisions 6, 8, 10, 11, First Presbyterian Church (Primary Entrance: 21st Street; Accessible Entrance: Chancellor Street)
 1. Re-designate entrance at Chancellor Street as the exclusive entrance.
 2. Shut down Chancellor Street for the day to vehicular traffic so that wheelchair users can use the street as an accessible route.
 3. Put a rubber mat down where the street crosses the building entrance.
 4. Put a rubber mat down at the threshold.
 5. Prop open doors to the voting area.
 - Ward 8, Divisions 12, 15, Sidney Hillman Medical Center (Chestnut Street)
 1. Prop open doors to the voting area.
 - Ward 8, Division 13, Greenfield School (Primary Entrance: Chestnut Street; Accessible Entrance: Sansom Street (schoolyard entrance))

Temporary Measures:

1. Re-designate entrance at Sansom Street as the exclusive entrance.
2. Prop open both exterior entrance doors.
3. Prop open both interior entrance doors.
4. Relocate voting area to the hall in front of the office.

Permanent Measures:

1. Install automatic door opening device(s) (with push plate wall switches for ingress and egress) so that existing exterior and interior vestibule doors at the schoolyard entrance (Sansom Street) open simultaneously.

2. Mount the push plate wall switches so that the centerline is no higher than 48 inches above the finished floor.
- Ward 8, Division 18, Penn Center House Apartments (JFK Boulevard)
 1. Prop open doors to the voting area.
 - Ward 8, Division 20, 1500 Locust Apartment House (Locust Street)
 1. Prop open doors to the voting area.
 - Ward 8, Division 21, Academy House Condominiums (Locust Street)
 1. Prop open doors to the voting area.
 - Ward 8, Division 24, Parkway House (Pennsylvania Avenue)
 1. The sidewalk to the building has steps on both sides. The driveway to the building may be used as the path of travel. Entrance should be up the right side of the driveway. Put down traffic cones on the left side of the driveway.
 2. Prop open left entrance door.
 - Ward 14, Divisions 2, 7, Harrison Homes (PHA) (Primary Entrance: 10th Street; Accessible Entrance: back door off parking lot)
 1. Re-designate entrance at back door off parking lot as the exclusive entrance.
 - Ward 18, Division 7, Adaire School (Thompson Street)
 1. Prop open at least one leaf of exterior double doors near the ramp at the rear of the school.
 - Ward 18, Divisions 16, 17, Towey Recreation Center (W. Berks Street)

Temporary Measures:

1. Prop open gate on W. Berks Street.
2. Prop open building entrance door.

Permanent Measures:

1. Install automatic door opening device(s) (with push plate wall switches for ingress and egress) for the entrance door.
2. Mount the push plate wall switches so that the centerline is no higher than 48 inches above the finished floor/ground.

- Wards 18, 19, Divisions 8, 14, 15, McKinley School (Primary Entrance: Orkney Street; Accessible Entrance: gym exit door to the left of the D House door)
 1. Re-designate entrance at gym as the exclusive entrance.
 2. Prop open door to gym since it has no hardware and no interior maneuvering clearance.
 3. We suggest relocating the voting area to the gym.
 4. If voting area is not relocated to the gym, then prop open all hallway doors.

- Ward 18, Divisions 11, 12, Penna Home (Susquehanna Avenue)

Temporary Measures:

1. Use a rubber mat at the building entrance over threshold.
2. Prop open door to the voting area.

Permanent Measures:

1. Remove 1 inch threshold and repair.
2. Install automatic door opening device(s) (with push plate wall switches for ingress and egress) for the door to the voting area.
3. Mount the push plate wall switches so that the centerline is no higher than 48 inches above the finished floor.

- Ward 18, Division 14, 15, Al-Aqsa Islamic Society (Primary Entrance: Germantown Avenue; Accessible Entrance: Cadwallader)

1. Re-designate the entrance at Cadwallader, which is the back door, as the exclusive entrance.

- Ward 19, Divisions 5, 6, Potter Thomas School (Primary Entrance: 6th Street/Gym entrance (has steps); Accessible Entrance: 6th Street/Gym entrance)

1. Re-designate accessible entrance at gym as the exclusive entrance.
2. Prop open both leaves of double doors at the gym entrance without the step.

- Ward 19, Division 8, Fairhill School (Somerset Street)

Temporary Measures:

1. Provide a temporary ramp that is at least 7 feet long at the step on Somerset Street.
2. Prop open entrance doors.

Permanent Measures:

1. Install a minimum 7 foot long ramp compliant with § 4.8 and Figs. 16 and 17 of the Americans with Disabilities Act Standards for Accessible Design (28 C.F.R. Part 36) at the Somerset Street entrance.

- Ward 19, Division 9, Fairhill Community High School (Primary Entrance: 4th Street; Accessible Entrance: Leithgow Street)

1. Re-designate accessible entrance at Leithgow Street as the exclusive entrance.
2. Prop open the door into the schoolyard from Leithgow Street.

- Ward 20, Division 1, Brown Community Center (8th Street)

Temporary Measures:

1. Prop open the door to Room No. 1.

Permanent Measures:

1. Replace the door knob on the entrance door to the polling area (Room No. 1) with a lever or other door hardware compliant with § 4.13.9 of the Americans with Disabilities Act Standards for Accessible Design (28 C.F.R. Part 36).

- Ward 20, Division 9, Norris Homes (PHA) (11th Street)

Temporary Measures:

1. Prop open entrance door.
2. Prop open all doors en route to voting area.

Permanent Measures:

1. Replace the door knob on the entrance door and on all doors en route to the voting area with a lever or other door hardware compliant with § 4.13.9 of the Americans with Disabilities Act Standards for Accessible Design (28 C.F.R. Part 36).

- Ward 24, Divisions 4, 13, McMichael School (Primary Entrance: Fairmount Avenue; Accessible Entrance: through parking lot)

1. Re-designate accessible entrance through parking lot as the exclusive entrance.
2. Prop open one leaf of exterior double doors at the parking lot entrance.

- Ward 24, Division 5, Powel School (Powelton Avenue)

Temporary Measures:

1. Provide a temporary ramp 5 feet long at the door to the lunch room.
2. Prop open the exterior door.

Permanent Measures:

1. Install a minimum 4½ foot long ramp compliant with § 4.8 and Figs. 16 and 17 of the American with Disabilities Act Standards for Accessible Design (28 C.F.R. Part 36) at the lunch room door.

- Ward 27, Divisions 1, 23, Fairfax Apartments (Locust Street)
 1. The building uses a 4 foot temporary ramp for the 4 inch step. A 2 foot temporary ramp is also needed for the 1½ inch step.
 2. Prop open the entrance door.
- Ward 27, Divisions 3, 11, Penn Care and Rehabilitation Center (Chestnut Street)
 1. Prop open the door to Chandler Lounge.
- Ward 27, Divisions 4, 12, Comegys School (Upland Street)
 1. Prop open one leaf of exterior double doors at Upland.
 2. Prop open one leaf of the gate from Upland.
- Ward 27, Divisions 6, 13, Catto Educational Center (Ludlow Street)
 1. Prop open both leaves of double doors at the far end of the gym.
- Ward 27, Division 9, Walnut Street West Library (Primary Entrance: Walnut Street; Accessible Entrance: Walnut Street closest to Meeting Room)
 1. Re-designate the exterior door on Walnut Street that is closest to the Meeting Room as the exclusive entrance to the polling area.
 2. Prop open the exterior door on Walnut Street that is closest to the Meeting Room.
- Ward 27, Divisions 10, 14, Spruce Hill Community Association (45th Street)
 1. Prop open entrance door.
- Ward 27, Divisions 16, 17, 48th and Woodland Rec Center (47th Street)

Temporary Measures:

1. Prop open interior doors on the route to the voting area.

Permanent Measures:

1. Adjust door closer on the interior door to the voting area so that it requires no more than 5 pounds of force to pull or push open compliant with § 4.13.11(2)(b) of the Americans with Disabilities Act Standards for Accessible Design (28 C.F.R. Part 36).

- Ward 27, Division 19, Rittenhouse Labs (33rd Street)
 1. Disable card slide so that doors are unlocked during voting hours or prop open entrance doors.

- Ward 31, Divisions 3, 13, Hackett School (Primary Entrance: Trenton Street; Accessible Entrance: York Street)
 1. Re-designate entrance at York Street as the exclusive entrance.
 2. Prop open York Street doors.
 3. Remove astragal at York Street doors.

- Ward 31, Division 7, SA Douglas School (Schoolyard)
 1. Prop open inner vestibule doors (from schoolyard) and remove astragal.

- Ward 31, Divisions 8, 9, Kensington High School Annex (Emerald Street)
 1. Prop building entrance door open.

- Ward 31, Divisions 11, 12, HA Brown School (Primary Entrance: Exterior entrance to gym; Accessible Entrance: School's main entrance)
 1. Re-designate school's main entrance as the exclusive entrance.
 2. Prop open both doors at the bottom of the ramp en route to the gym from the main entrance.

- Ward 37, Division 1, Ebenezer Baptist Church (Primary Entrance: 10th Street; Accessible Entrance: Dauphin Street)
 1. Do not re-designate the accessible entrance as the exclusive entrance because the temporary ramp may be difficult for some voters to traverse and the temporary ramp runs across the entire width of the Dauphin Street entrance.
 2. Post signs at the front of the church on 10th Street and on the Dauphin Street side directing voters to the accessible entrance on Dauphin.
 3. Place 3 foot temporary ramp at building entrance on Dauphin.
 4. Relocate voting area to the Deacon's office.

- Ward 37, Divisions 6, 7, 8, Salvation Army (9th and Huntington) (Note: There currently are two separate entrances to the voting area in the gym, but there will be only one entrance if the voting area is moved as we recommend.)
 1. Relocate voting area from inaccessible gym to lobby at main entrance or game room.

- Ward 37, Division 14, Hartranft School (Eighth Street)
 1. Prop open 8th Street entrance doors.
 2. Remove astragal at 8th Street entrance doors.

- Ward 46, Division 5, Boys Latin Charter School (Primary Entrance: Cedar Avenue; Accessible Entrance: Parking lot side door)
 1. Do not re-designate the accessible entrance as the exclusive entrance because there is an elevator from the accessible entrance to the voting area and it would not be equipped to handle a great amount of voter traffic.
 2. Post signs at the front of the school and on the parking lot side directing voters to the accessible entrance from the parking lot.
- Ward 52, Division 2, River Park House Apartments (Conshohocken Avenue)
 1. Relocate voting area to Hospitality Room.
 2. Prop open both doors to Hospitality Room.
- Ward 52, Division 3, Presidential City Apartments/Madison Building (Main entrance to leasing office)
 1. There are doors directly from parking lot to voting area, but route is inaccessible as it is too steep. It is unclear whether these doors are used on voting day. They should not be and the main entrance to leasing office should be used for all voters.
 2. Provide 1½ inch high threshold ramp at 1½ inch level change at main entrance to leasing office.
 3. Prop open both leaves of doors at entrance to the voting area (party room).
- Ward 52, Division 10, Park Plaza Condominiums (Ford Road)
 1. Prop open all doors en route to voting area.
- Ward 52, Division 14, John C. Anderson Cultural Center (Overbrook Avenue)
 1. Prop open exterior doors.
 2. Prop open vestibule doors.
 3. Prop open voting area doors.
- Ward 52, Division 16, Fairview Arms Apartments (53rd Avenue)
 1. Provide temporary ramp at least 6 feet 6 inches long and place parallel to short concrete ramp.
 2. Prop open both leaves of double entrance doors.
 3. Provide a low pile mat that is at least 3 foot x 2 foot and place over threshold.

POLLING PLACES THAT ARE INACCESSIBLE AND SHOULD BE RELOCATED

The following polling places have been surveyed by the United States and have been determined to be inaccessible under the standards agreed to in this case. The United States has further determined that temporary measures cannot be implemented to make the polling places accessible on election day. For this group of polling places, we recommend that each polling place be relocated to an existing polling place location or to another site. If the City determines that the relocation of a particular division is not possible, then the United States will continue to work with the City to locate an alternative location for the division.

- Ward 1, Division 13, Barber Shop, 1424 South 5th Street, is inaccessible; RELOCATE TO: Ward 1, Divisions 14, 15, Dickinson Square Recreation Center, 4th and Tasker Streets.
- Ward 1, Division 18, Store, 1801 South 2nd Street, is inaccessible; RELOCATE TO: Ward 1, Division 21, Oregon New Years Association, 1728 South 2nd Street.
- Ward 2, Division 1, Southwark House Community Center, 101 Ellsworth Street, is inaccessible; RELOCATE TO: The Mummings Museum, 1100 South 2nd Street.
- Ward 2, Division 4, Capitolo Recreation Center, 9th and Federal Streets, is inaccessible; RELOCATE TO: Ward 2, Divisions 5, 8, 10, St. Marons Church, 1013 Ellsworth Street.
- Ward 6, Division 3, Mt. Pisgah AME Church, 432 North 41st Street, is inaccessible; RELOCATE TO: Ward 6, Division 7, Shepherd Senior Center, 642 North 41st Street.
- Ward 6, Division 9, Calvary Episcopal Church, 814 North 41st Street, is inaccessible; RELOCATE TO: Ward 6, Division 11, Sarah Allen Senior Housing, 4035 Parrish Street.
- Ward 6, Division 13, Phoenix II Rehab Center, 901 N. 43rd Street, is inaccessible; RELOCATE TO: Ward 6, Division 10, CEP School, 43rd and Westminster Streets.
